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Dress Code Policy

The dress and grooming of students shall be clean and should NOT:

1. Cause an actual distraction or disturbance to a school activity
2. Create a health or safety hazard to themselves or others
3. Invade the rights of others

Per GGUSD Board of Education Policy 5160.1.

- Students enrolled in district schools shall present themselves in a manner conducive to study and educational advancement.
- A student's personal grooming and dress should be neat, clean, and appropriate for the demands of the activities in which the student is participating.
- Parents assert a major responsibility for their student's appearance, not only in providing the clothing, but in guiding the student in the selection and wear of appropriate school apparel.
- Footwear shall be worn at all times on the campus. Reflecting a concern for safety, footwear should correspond with the demands and attributes of the activity in which the student participates.
- Apparel or accessories shall not contain any obscene or offensive logos, graphics, or hand-written wording depicting drugs, illicit substances, alcoholic beverages, or sexually suggestive topics.
- Apparel, accessories, and head coverings, including hats and caps, shall not be permitted when such apparel is associated with or reflects gang affiliation or gang identity by virtue of its colors, trademarks, or other design arrangement.
- The principal or the designee is responsible for deciding questions of appropriateness of student dress and grooming at Fitz.

UNACCEPTABLE

- Any clothing that is too tight or revealing, any clothing that is oversized (a size or two than typical size for student) or allows undergarments to be exposed
- P.E. clothes worn outside of Physical Education class

Hats

- Hoods not to be worn on campus or inside classrooms
- No caps that are associated with or reflects gang affiliation or gang identity by virtue of its colors, trademarks, or other design arrangement

Tops

- No apparel that is associated with or reflects gang affiliation or gang identity by virtue of its colors, trademarks, or other design
- Bare mid-drift blouses halter top/underwear style tops, tops with no straps, or tops with low necklines
- No "Pro-club" style sweats (sweat pants and sweat shirts) in any color
- No solid, plain colored t-shirts in white, black, gray, dark blue, or light blue.

Bottoms

- No apparel that is associated with or reflects gang affiliation or gang identity by virtue of its colors, trademarks, or other design
- Short shorts are not allowed and must not show any undergarments.
- No "Dickies" or "Dickies"-type pants of any color
- No "Pro-club" style sweats (sweat pants and sweat shirts) in any color

If a student chooses to violate the dress code policy by wearing attire that does not meet the dress code policy (including during any school events or school trips), the following progressive discipline steps will be applied:

1st offense: change into appropriate attire, confiscation of attire, notification of violation to parent/guardian by teacher/staff, student pick up inappropriate attire in office after dismissal

2nd offense: change into appropriate attire, confiscation of attire, notification of violation to parent/guardian by teacher/staff, parent/guardian pick up of inappropriate attire after dismissal and meeting with SAPD SRO, student assigned one hour of Falcon Recovery Time.

3rd offense: change into appropriate attire, confiscation of attire, notification of violation to parent/guardian by teacher/staff, parent/guardian pick-up of inappropriate attire on the last day of school, student assigned one hour of Falcon Recovery Time

Subsequent and repetitive offenses will follow progressive discipline on a case by case basis.
